

Financing your Webster education

Webster University is a private, non-profit university which strives to provide high quality learning experiences that transform students for global citizenship and individual excellence.

Approximately twenty percent of Webster Vienna's students receive financial support through scholarships, sponsorships, U.S. Federal Aid or other options. As with any other major investment, deciding which university to attend requires a thorough comparison of all the variables. SPONSORSHIP

Organizations or individuals may sponsor a student's education at Webster and can obtain tax benefits by sponsoring their employee's education.

PRIVATE STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS

Webster Vienna cooperates with Austrian banks such as Erste Bank, Wüstenrot, Raiffeisenbank, Bank Austria for individual student loans. To determine if an Austrian private loan, or a loan from a bank or private lender in your country of origin, is the right choice for you, please visit our website or contact our Senior Finance and Financial Aid Officer.

REIMBURSEMENT BY INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS FOR UNDERGRADUATES

Parents employed at international organizations such as UN, UNIDO, IAEA, CTBTO, etc. can approach their employer to determine if they are eligible for partial reimbursement of educational expenses.

U.S. FINANCIAL AID

American citizens and greencard holders are eligible for various forms of financial assistance from the U.S. government, including student loans and VA benefits. Loans include Stafford, PLUS, or private U.S. educational loans for undergraduate and graduate students. A Pell Grant is also available for undergraduate students depending on eligibility.

TAX PAYERS

In many countries educational expenses are tax deductible. Parents and student tax payers should check with their tax advisor to determine if they may claim (part of) the educational expenses on their yearly tax return.

Austrian citizens: Students employed full-time may deduct educational expenses ("Weiterbildung/Ausbildung/Umschulung") from their taxes if they can demonstrate that their coursework is necessary for their employment, or is part of the training for a new career. The amount refunded by the tax authorities in Austria depends on the student's income.

PARTNER IN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

AUSTRIAN FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

Austrian citizens and non-Austrian students whose parents have been employed in Austria for a minimum of five years may be eligible for assistance from the Austrian government (Familienbeihilfe, Studienunterstützung, Selbsterhalterstipendien, etc.). WEBSTER VIENNA SCHOLARSHIPS

Webster Vienna encourages incoming undergraduate (bachelor), transfer, and graduate (master) students with exceptional academic achievement and proven financial need to apply for a partial Webster Vienna Scholarship. Applicants must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on the American 4-point scale. Webster Vienna Scholarships cover up to 50% of tuition for newly accepted applicants.

WEBSTER VIENNA LEGACY TUITION GRANT

The Webster Vienna Legacy Tuition Grant is a program that offers a 10% reduction in tuition for first-time freshmen whose sibling or parent (core family) currently attends or graduated from Webster Vienna Private University. A 5% reduction in tuition may apply to extended family members (aunts, uncles, nephews, nieces, grandchildren etc.).

WEBSTER VIENNA SECOND DEGREE GRANT

Webster Vienna Alumni (students who have a degree from Webster Vienna Private University) who begin a second degree can have tuition fees waived for the last class of their second degree prior to graduation.

WORK STUDY SCHOLARSHIPS

The university has a limited number of Work Study scholarships available where students receive partial tuition coverage in return for working as student assistants. Work Study positions in the library, Academic Department, Admissions Department etc. offer students valuable work experience.

The duration of Work Study scholarships varies from five to ten terms, depending on the number of hours worked per term.

→ Eligibility: Currently enrolled degree-seeking students at Webster Vienna with a minimum GPA of 3.0 may apply after their first term.

BA OR BS PROGRAM

Duration: 3–4 years

Total Credits: minimum of 128 credits (assuming no advanced standing credits have been awarded)

Annual Tuition (Fall and Spring semester): EURO 19,520

Fall or Spring semester:

- **Full time (12–18 credits, or 4–6 courses** per semester):**
EURO 9,760
(above 18 credits, additional EURO 610 per credit hour)
- **Part time (up to 11 credits per semester):**
EURO 1,830 per 3-credit hour course

Summer term: EURO 1,830 per 3-credit hour course (optional term; not included in the annual tuition fee)

** One regular course has 3 credit hours.

Full-time, semester undergraduate students have the option to split the tuition payment and pay 50% prior to each term of the semester according to the payment deadlines.

Undergraduate students planning to study abroad:

Students attending other Webster campus sites pay their home campus tuition rate for up to 5 terms (or 6 terms, if the 6th term is Fall II or Spring II of an academic year). If a student stays longer than 5 terms at another Webster campus, they are considered a permanent transfer to that campus and begin paying the tuition fee of their new home campus. To become a permanent transfer, students need to apply with their Academic Advisor.

There are academic restrictions related to the length of studies abroad and the Austrian accreditation of Webster Vienna Private University. Please see your Academic Advisor for more information.

Duration: 2 years

Total Courses: 14 (48 credits)

Per Course Fee: EURO 2,160

Program Fee: EURO 34,560

Applicants who do not have the required academic background for their intended majors are required to take prerequisite courses before starting their degree program. Up to three additional courses (prerequisites) may be required for the MA, MS and MBA programs. Applicants for the MA in Psychology who do not have a Bachelor in Psychology will be required to take at least 8 prerequisite courses.

Prerequisite courses will increase the duration of your studies and the program tuition fee.
