

## Guidelines for Poster Presenters - SEA 2018



### Overview

- Posters will be displayed at the SEA Conference in two poster sessions on June 11<sup>th</sup> and June 12<sup>th</sup> at 12:15-13:15. Poster presenters must be on hand with their poster during the session.
- You may use any of the poster templates provided (see below) or your own templates.
- Please email your final poster in **PPT** or **PDF** file to [sea2018@webster.ac.at](mailto:sea2018@webster.ac.at) no later than May 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018.
- The posters will be produced on campus. They will be printed on paper and mounted on panels or on easels with foam-core board backing.

### Poster Templates

To use a template, click on the image to download it to your computer. It will be a PowerPoint file. Name and save it on your computer.

The file will be a single PowerPoint slide with boxes of text and image placeholders. Simply replace the text and placeholders with your own text and images. Click on the background to change its color.



## Poster Message

A poster is a graphic display of your work. It is a signature of your research. The best posters make one and only one point. What do you want viewers to learn? They should be able to identify immediately your Big Question.

## Design and Layout

### Sections

There are no hard-and-fast rules for the sections in a poster. Here is a suggested list:

- Title (with names of authors and affiliations)
- Introduction/Objectives/Aims/Problem/Goal
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusion
- References
- Acknowledgements
