*Jozef Bátora* is Univ.-Professor in International Relations and Institutions in the International Relations Department at Webster Vienna Private University and Professor at the Department of Political Science, Comenius University. His research focuses on change and stability of international institutions, organization theory, diplomacy, EU governance and change dynamics in global security. Previously, he held posts as senior researcher at ARENA - Centre for European Studies at the University of Oslo; fellow at the Institute for European Integration Research at the Austrian Academy of Sciences; visiting professor at The Europe Center, Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies at Stanford University and as visiting scholar at SCANCOR, Stanford University. He has published widely in peer-reviewed journals and served as coordinating editor of Journal of International Relations and Development. He holds a PhD in political science from the University of Oslo, MPhil. in Public Administration from the University of Bergen and BA in political science from Comenius University.
